RUGBY UNION:

Townsville Defeats Brisbane University

Townsville district comfortably defeated a disappointing Brisbane University team at the Sports Reserve on Saturday afternoon. The final score of 20 points to 9 does not indicate the difference between the teams, as Townsville scored six tries to two.

Only one of the winner's tries was converted and the margin might well have been greater had the capable Air Force kicker, Dwyer, been given an opportunity.

It appears that the visiting team was far from full-strength. This is no doubt because the rapid growth of the code in the North, both in numbers and quality, has not as yet been fully realised in the South. It is to be hoped that future teams sent up will be selected with this in mind.

The Townsville team itself was somewhat disappointing, but once the issue got beyond doubt with a 14-3 lead at half time it did not appear to put the pressure on as much as it should have. Its forwards need expert coaching in line-out play, as they were badly beaten in this aspect of the game.

It also suffered from the absence of the army hooker, Andrews, who usually wins a very fair share of the ball. However, the team must be congratulated on a good win which will mean much to Townsville as a seal of its quality.

HIGHLIGHT

Highlight of the first half were two fine tries by breakaway Morrissey. In the first he came up like a back alongside Price to take the ball and beat the opposition. In the second again well up with the play, he dived on the ball in a scramble on the line.

Turner scored after a good backline move while Galbraith added three points with a typical strong run. The only score for the visitors in this half was a penalty kicked by Johnstone.

The best try of the match was that scored by Price, after the interval. In this move he passed to his winger and joined in the move again to create the overlap. Lukus scored

near the corner as the result of good backing up when, the ball having come along the backline, there was insufficient room and Lukus was in perfect position to take an in-pass to go over.

For the visitors Johnstone, who played well in the centre, scored after a passing move and Smith made a long strong run down the side line to cross near the corner flag. The home backs played well, but seemed to lack penetration on occasions. The visitors' defence, however, was fairly solid. The forwards were unable to gain possession of the ball as much as could be desired. Douglas had a very good game.

TOO STRONG

In the supporting fixture Townsville District Second 15 was too strong for Combined Services. The superiority, however, only became evident in the second half, the half time score being 6-3.

The first half was not only even in the scoring but territorially and it appeared that either team might win. The main winning factor was the greater speed in the winners' backline, speedsters Crossland and Mason scoring five tries between them by outpacing the defence. The other backs did well, Hannan giving good service. The packs just about matched each other. For the losers Ingamells and Latimore had good games.

The late game will be between Brisbane University and Townsville University, though there is a possibility that the two Universities may combine to play a Townsville team. Either way the match should be hard and fast.

BIG THINGS IN TOWNSVILLE

The 10-team Townsville Rugby competition is nearing its close.

In the Semi Finals on August 24th, Lavarack (6RAR) 19 defeated University 15, in the No. 1 Semi Final. University were hot favourites having scored 292 points to 62 against, and strengthened by the return of Laurie Lawrence, former Wallaby and Queensland half back.

Although University led 10 to 6 at half time and scored three tries

to two, our northern reporter tells us that the Army boys really deserved their victory, and confirmed the promise that they had been showing in defeating other Services Sides over the last few weeks.
